

MONROVIA COMMUNIQUE

POSITION STATEMENT ON THE WAY FORWARD FROM THE RECONCILIATION AND PEACE BUILDING CONFERENCE HELD BY THE LIBERIAN COUNCIL OF CHURCHES IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE PROGRAM FOR CHRISTIAN—MUSLIM RELATIONS IN AFRICA (PROCMURA), MARCH 24-26, 2010



STATEMENT

We, the Religious Leaders representing Christians, Muslims and non-governmental organizations operating in Liberia, convened in Monrovia, Liberia, from March 24—26, 2010, at the St. Peter's Lutheran Church and the Liberia Council of Churches, under the auspices of the Liberia Area Committee of the Program for Christian Muslim Relations in Africa, in partnership with the Program for Christian Muslim Relations in Africa (PROCMURA), based in Nairobi, Kenya at a Conference on Reconciliation and Peace-building, under the theme, "Sustaining the Peace Through Unity."

Recognizing the ONENESS of the Almighty God, the Creator of the universe;

Recognizing that Christianity and Islam are two major religions in Liberia;

Recognizing the ardent and sacred responsibilities given by the Almighty God to Leaders of the two religions to convey the message of peace, love, unity, freedom, justice and liberty to their followers;

And whereas it is incumbent on the followers of these two religions (according to the teachings of their Holy Books) to recognize and respect the rights and dignity of their fellow human beings, irrespective of race, colour, class or religion.

We have therefore assembled to address the following:

- Religious leaders as agents of peace
- Peace between Christians and Muslims as a prerequisite for Christian and Muslim religious advocacy for peace within the wider society
- Negative religious expansionist policies
- Ethnicity allied to religion
- Globalization/internationalization/importation/exportation of conflicts
- The challenge of translating good precepts in religion into good practice into everyday life
- Negative solidarity
- Causes of conflicts (immediate and root causes)
- Advocacy for peace by example

- Overview of the present state of Christian-Muslim Relations in the Mano River Area
- Current Christian-Muslim relations in Liberia

Challenges to Social Cohesion and Religious Plurality in Liberia as it Relates to the Rule of Law

The Role of Religious Leaders in Peace Building

In recognition of the deliberations, the Conference resolved on a positive Way Forward:

- Encourage Church groups not belonging to LCC to come in and work with the Council
- Take the conference to the counties
- Zone up the country to have Muslim and Christian leaders to jointly carry out the dialogue within their communities
- Put state interest ahead of religious or ethnic interests, then work together in unity
- Transform recommendations into project proposals for implementation
- Involve the media to propagate and promote the message of peace and reconciliation
- Reinforce intra-Christian and intra-Muslim relations and meetings
